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### 1. Current news and issues

- DOE – \*Seifert indicated that Knerr would be on a special detail to prep for the PGDP transition in the event of shutdown of USEC. He also indicated that Rachel Blumenfeld would be taking over Knerr' duties for DOE in his absence, and that either she or himself would be serving as DDFO for CAB board meetings.
- Contractors
- CAB – \*Roberts reported that things were closer on finalizing the 2013 Work Plan, and should be ready by the September 20<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

### 2. Sub-committee reports

- Waste Disposition Options Alternatives - \*Smith indicated that the State of Kentucky regulators needed to be on board with the alternatives that would be presented during the WDO workshop. As soon as that was accomplished, the workshop would be scheduled. He also said that it looked like the public meeting would probably be scheduled for some time in November. Seifert said that there would be a dry run of the Workshop for the Board members before the Public Workshop. Young indicated that Wheeler and himself had been developing the content of the Recommendation. Clayton said that there was material that was developed in the past that never did make it to the recommendation stage, that might be useful now to help in the development. Roberts suggested that a Recommendation be developed before the Public Meeting on the WDO. Peterson indicated that the public comment might be needed to help develop the CAB's recommendation.
- C-400
- Historic Preservation (Ben, Judy) – \*Roberts reported that the Paducah Sun had expressed an interest in printing the History book and also to help distribute it to the public.
- Adaptive Reuse Initiative (Ken/Eric) - \*Wheeler indicated that they plan to have a path forward by September 15. Young said that they hoped to have the next summit meeting some time in November.
- Burial Grounds - \*Kemp said that he thought the CAB should be close to making a recommendation on the Remedial Action Plan for SWMUs 5 & 6, and commenting on the Feasibility Study. Roberts said that Bruce Ford, the project manager for LATA, had indicated that he thought it would be a good idea to provide some type of education about the project to the subcommittee. Kemp said that the Feasibility Study was written in general terms and he thought that because of future use of the site, the information needed to be more detailed.

4. Open Recommendations – \*Smith said that DOE would have Recommendation 12-03 closed relatively soon.

5. CAB Meetings - \*Roberts suggested that for the September 20<sup>th</sup> Board meeting, to have a shortened meeting covering elections of chair and vice-chair, and review and vote of the 2013 Work Plan. Afterward, break into subcommittee groups to decide what members will be on which subcommittee. Clayton asked for a SWMU 4 update from DOE to be presented at the Board meeting. Kemp indicated that he planned to bring a couple of student representatives to sit in on the Board meeting. Wheeler said that he could talk to WKCTC/UK College of Engineering officials to see if there might be any student candidates for this position on the board.

6. SSAB Chairs Activities – Fall meeting – October 2 & 3 - Washington, DC - \*Roberts suggested coming up with one issue and priority to present during the fall Chairs meeting, and promote DOE at Paducah's ability to get a lot done for the funds given them to do it.

Meeting was adjourned at 4:07 pm.
