

**Community Concerns Subcommittee Meeting  
January 9, 2003, CAB office**

Rhodes called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

**Response to the Questionnaire Regarding Potential CAB (Citizens Advisory Board)  
Recommendation on Compensation to Water Policy Residents**

Rhodes reported that 37 of 98 questionnaires have been returned. The questionnaire was sent to plant neighbors who participate in the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Water Policy Program. The subcommittee wanted community input before proposing a recommendation on compensation for landowners. All of the responses received are in agreement with the proposed recommendation.

Rhodes said the subcommittee should ask the Board to proceed in making the recommendation since all of the responses from the community are in favor of it. Donham and Long agreed.

**Joe Carson**

Rhodes said he has had the opportunity to speak with Joe Carson. He would like to recommend that the Board invite Joe Carson to speak at a Board meeting regarding his experiences with DOE. Rhodes also suggested the Board should ask for DOE to reimburse Carson for travel. Donham and Long agreed.

**Other**

Donham said the subcommittee should request DOE to present any information they have regarding the operations and design of the smelter. He stated he would like information on what was smelted and what kind of emissions were a result of those operations. Donham also wants to know if any pollution monitoring took place. Donham reported the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) documents he received on the subject indicate a tremendous amount of smelting took place onsite.

Long stated she would like for the CAB to host a chairs' meeting to let people from other sites see how close people live to the plant.
