The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m.

**End State Review/Study**

Tanner said he drafted a letter to the Board, Ex-Officios, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and concerned citizens requesting their input on the end-use of the site. He said he would like to receive comments by the end of August.

Tanner suggested inviting people from East Tennessee Technology Park in Oak Ridge not associated with the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) to participate in the Long Range Strategy/Stewardship Meeting on August 14 via teleconference. He said East Tennessee Technology Park has been reindustrialized and could provide advice to the task force.

Tanner said at the next task force meeting that there will be aerial maps of the area prior to the construction of the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant (PGDP). Tanner said the aerial maps would help the task force determine the future of the area.

The task force reviewed a color-coded map of the area. Donham asked if there were cleanup levels associated with each color. Dollins said no. Donham stated cleanup levels for various contaminants have been an issue at Rocky Flats. He said if waste is placed in the C-746-U Landfill or a Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) cell, it will impact his preference on the end-use of the site. Dollins said cleanup levels are established on a project by project basis. Tanner said if water is on-site, then the

cleanup must meet the warm water adequate standards. Donham said both Bayou Creeks are considered impaired streams and asked if the creeks have a total maximum daily load (TMDL). Miller said there is a TMDL for Little Bayou Creek. Donham requested the TMDL and prime contaminants of concern for Little Bayou Creek. Moore asked if the creeks are monitored. Tanner said there has been considerable monitoring in Little Bayou Creek and the North-South Diversion Ditch (NSDD).

Raper asked if DOE has a vision for the end state of the site. Dollins said land use maps have been developed.

### **Stewardship Questions to Office of Legacy Management (OLM)/Environmental Management (EM)**

Tanner suggested the task force update the stewardship questions that will be sent to the OLM and EM.

Tanner said he sent an email to Mike Owen regarding what involvement, if any, the OLM will have with the Site Specific Advisory Board's (SSABs). Tanner said Mike Owen responded and said that EM, not the OLM, will support the Citizens Advisory Board (CAB). The OLM will not have presence at the Paducah site until closure is complete. Tanner requested his email to Mike Owen and the response be provided in the July Board packet.

Kemp said there are some closure sites that interact with the OLM.

### **Task Force Cancellation Policy**

Tanner said the Long Range Strategy/Stewardship Task Force is proposing a task force cancellation policy for the Board's consideration. Tanner said the policy on cancellation of task force meetings would be incorporated in the Operating Procedures. Donham suggested adding a clause to the cancellation policy stating that in the event of unusual circumstances, task force meetings may be cancelled with less than one week notification. The proposed policy will be presented to the Board at the July meeting.

Donham asked if Board members could vote at a task force meeting even if they are not a member of the task force. Tanner said it was his understanding that only members of the task force could vote; however, the task force's decision must go in front of the Board for consensus.

Tanner suggested that at the July Board Meeting members need to consider what task forces and subcommittees they would like to serve on. Kemp suggested task forces be updated every September.

The meeting adjourned at 3:13 p.m.

Action Items:

- Staff: Provide call in information to Oak Ridge contacts for the August 14 Long Range Strategy/Stewardship Meeting.
- Staff: Add a clause to the task force cancellation policy that in the event of unusual circumstances (i.e. weather), task force meetings may be cancelled with less than one week notification.
- Staff: Provide Donham with TMDL set for Little Bayou Creek and the prime contaminant of concern.
- Staff: Provide Board with email sent to Mike Owens and his response.
- Tanner: Forward stewardship questions to EM.
