The meeting was called to order at 4:45 p.m.

**Agenda Items**

1. Project Updates – Lee said the project updates be deleted from the task force agenda since the updates are given in the full Board meeting.
2. Geographic Information System (GIS) Database Demonstration – Steve Hampson, Kentucky Research for Energy and the Environment, demonstrated some of the information available through the GIS database system. Lee said that the database has some of the information that the task force has requested for the End Condition Maps. Russell requested that the maps indicate the boundaries of the Land Acquisition Study area and the private parcels within that study. Hampson said that information is not available on the GIS system at this time. Lee said that Jeff Snook, DOE, has told the task force that certain areas could be identified with the stage that it is currently in such as what projects had received a Record of Decision and whether it would be used as recreational or industrial. Hampson said information could be added to the GIS system. Russell said this community has contributed to the benefit of this country and should not be left with land that is unusable. Lee said Williams brought up a program called Ready for Reuse at the last meeting. Williams said Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) is the legal term used prior to transfer of property from the federal government. Dollins said reindustrialization is not DOE's charter, it is environmental cleanup. Russell said if DOE limits itself to environmental cleanup, this community would be left with land that is unusable. Williams said everything in the remediation program has to do with reuse, it cannot be said that the mission cuts off at environmental cleanup. All of the land use controls that are put in the RODs and the Property Acquisition Study examine reuse. Doug Frost, Deputy Federal Official for all of the CABs, said he understands the reindustrialization issue and the reuse issue said there is an interrelationship between cleanup standards. Cleanup decisions cannot be made without knowing

what the end condition will be. Williams said he has been on a dozen restoration advisory boards throughout the country and reuse is the operational blueprint. This CAB is not going down the wrong path and what they are asking for is what most places already have. Dollins said what the CAB is asking for is what we are working on. Lee said she gives the credit to Brian Begley and Brian Baker for suggesting the CAB utilize the GIS database.

3. Land Use Maps – Gardner provided base maps that Paducah Remediation Services prepared for the task force indicating the trichloroethylene plumes, Technetium-99 plumes, water sampling box, Water Policy box, DOE boundary and private land holdings. Russell said the CAB needs to know where DOE is with the decision-making process. Maybriar said the state is working with EPA and DOE on establishing what buildings need to come down and right now there are seven buildings that would be decontaminated and decommissioned. Dollins said there is a baseline. He said he would meet with Gardner on what information could be provided for the August task force meeting. Williams said Ready for Reuse is a congressional goal for all sites that are on the National Priorities List to report when the site would be ready for reuse and that goal for the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant is 2047. Lee asked if she could obtain a password for access to the GIS database to make the end condition maps. Hampson said the CAB could not have access to 100 percent of the GIS database. Lee requested that someone work with the CAB on a monthly basis to utilize the data. Dollins said he would check on that.
