Meeting Summary  
May 18, 2006 \* CAB Office**

The meeting was called to order at 4:45 p.m.

**Agenda Items**

1. Land Use Maps – Russell discussed his additional ideas on the overlays. Dollins said he would invite Paducah Remediation Services (PRS) to the June task force meeting to discuss the maps and overlays. He said he would need to check on whether the overlays are part of PRS’s contract to support the Citizens Advisory Board (CAB) or if there would be a cost to the CAB. Russell said he assumed all of the requested information would be in the U.S. Department of Energy’s (DOE) database. Lee said the overlays requested by the CAB might be the same maps that the Kentucky Research Consortium for Energy and the Environment could include in the Land Use Acquisition study.
2. Southwest Plume Site Investigation Update – Dollins said the Site Investigation Report was submitted to the regulators on May 17, 2006. Russell requested a summary page identifying the questions that the study should answer, the principle findings, and the conclusions. Dollins asked staff to contact Rich Bonczek, DOE, to draft the summary page for the next task force meeting. He asked for the summary page to be sent to Russell prior to the task force meeting.
3. C-400 Source Removal Update – Dollins said fieldwork to support the design would begin soon. Borings will begin in June.
4. Surface Water Operable Unit (SWOU) On-Site Update – Dollins said the Site Investigation Report is due to the regulators on August 16, 2006. Russell requested a summary page identifying the questions that the study should answer, the principle findings, and the conclusions. Dollins said that could be provided after the document was submitted to the regulators.
5. C-746-U Landfill Update – Dollins said he could not speak to the updates on the landfill. Russell said he had received correspondence that drums had been delivered to the landfill that did not meet waste acceptance criteria within the last month. Vanderboegh said generators not meeting waste acceptance criteria (WAC) was delivered to the landfill on numerous occasions. He said he notified personnel but no corrective action was taken. He said the in the last month of operation BJC employees harassed him and his employees trying to get the waste streams to the landfill that did not meet WAC. He said the infractions were reported to DOE and nothing stopped and it was reported to the Kentucky

regulators and nothing stopped. Vanderboegh said Mitch McConnell is aware of these issues including the discharge of water into the Commonwealth streams without treatment of the rad contaminates and the proposed delivery of bulk waste to the landfill without going through the appropriate permit modifications. Vanderboegh said there are protective measures under the DOE program called the Employee Concerns Program. He said this program ended up being a Whistleblower Program that targeted the people coming forward. Russell asked if the landfill is currently in operation. Vanderboegh said PRS is currently the operator for the landfill. Russell asked if material is being put in the landfill that did not meet WAC. He said if there is, the CAB has to be concerned. Dollins said the landfill is currently taking waste that meets WAC. Vanderboegh said there was a situation that took place in the last three weeks of operation when a generator proposed disposal and crushed drums on a closed landfill and pictures were taken that show the contractor doing this. The contractor then changed the classification of the drums from clean to rad. He said this brings forth a whole new picture for waste acceptance of that landfill. He said that was a violation of Solid Waste Management Unit requirements of processing waste on a closed landfill.
