Community Involvement Subcommittee Meeting Summary February 17, 2011 • 5:30 p.m. CAB Office, 115 Memorial Drive

The committee briefly discussed two primary subjects: (1) Kentucky Environmental Quality Commission (KEQC) and its annual awards, and (2) tabling the Speaker's Bureau until later in the year.

KEQC is a board appointed by the governor to serve a public sounding board for the state government on environmental issues. KEQC annually presents 10 awards to individuals or organizations that have made a positive impact on environmental awareness. Smith agreed to look into the KEQC nominations process and criteria for winning such an award.

Young had mentioned to staff that it might be beneficial to postpone launching the Speaker's Bureau until after the Eco Fair and the release of KRCEE's Future Use Study. The committee was agreeable to this course of action.

A lengthier discussion took place with Ethridge updating the subcommittee on the progress of planning this year's Eco Fair event. Ethridge has contacted schools and presenters. The most pressing issue facing the event is the funding. The committee will discuss potential avenues for funding and grants when it reconvenes.
