



Manager's Minute May 20, 2014

Two important project activities start this week as part of our ongoing work to clean up the Paducah site. The first is the full-scale demolition of the C-410 Building a few weeks ahead of our previous June start-up target. Demolition officially began May 13 with removal of two stairwells on the east wall of the building to clear the way for taking down the rest of the exterior paneling. Last week, crews completed air gapping the fluorine line from the north stack and finished pouring low-density concrete in two zones to provide an area to collect water runoff during demolition. This week, excavators with shears will start razing the structure. Demolition to slab is expected to be completed by this fall.



Also this week, teams will start characterizing material stored in the C-746-B Warehouse. The area contains an estimated 53,000 cubic feet of old equipment and material from past PGDP enrichment operations. The project, scheduled for completion by the end of the calendar year, will characterize, package, and ship the waste to appropriate disposal sites.

Congratulations to all who have worked so diligently to keep both projects moving ahead.

C-400 TCE Removal

C-400—The electrical resistance heating system continues to effectively remove volatile organic compounds containing TCE from the ground near the C-400 Cleaning Building. Starting this week, 996 gallons had been recovered at an average heating temperature of about 208°F.
